A Isham, Elizabeth and the Seven Families

Using a computer program named "ROOTS" my husband, Averill Stewart Keith and I have put together Haston family names and dates, to form a genealogical record that could be printed and shared with all my cousins and their relatives. I want to thank those that contributed information.

"Roots" assembles individual records by tying together "spouses", "parents", and "children". The Haston records include 250 individuals, all of whom are tied with one or more others in the files. "Roots" also provides a number of ways that individual records may be assembled; Descendants, Ancestors, Families, etc. They can be displayed in several different manners. The one way that we have chosen most often is "Descendants in Box Charts".

Since viewers of genealogies quickly look for "me" or "our family", we have elected to begin the display of Haston families by recognizing all of the seven children born to Isham and Elizabeth. To find your place in the family chose the "Box Chart Descendant" display for your ancestor who is, Horace, Myrtle Della, Arthur, Arrie Belle, Isham (Ica), Elizabeth (Betty), or James. If we have been given your name, you are listed in one of those.

NOTE If you are not listed, I want to know. Call us on 858-451-7823. Of course, I suggest you do it soon. I am Carolyn Haston Keith and I am 82 years old. I have no long term life guarantee nor does Averill at 85.

If you are looking for older ancestors, look in Section B, "Daniel to David to Isaac to Isham" or Section C "The French Connection".



The photograph above, while faded, is the best one that I have of the whole Isham Haston family. The man with the hat is Isham B. Haston at age 47. His wife, Elizabeth Catherine Parker, is holding their last baby. She is 43. I know their ages because the baby is my father and he was born in 1899. I am Carolyn Haston Keith.

I will name each person in the picture so you, perhaps, can identify your grand-person, great-grand person or perhaps your great-great-grand person. Later I'll include "Box Charts" listing all their descendants.

On the extreme right, is Horace, Isham and Elizabeth's first child, born May 9, 1879.

On the other end, in the black cape, is Myrtle Della. She was born Nov 6, 1881.

The third child, born Jan 19, 1884 is Arrie Belle. She is the tall young lady, 2nd from left.

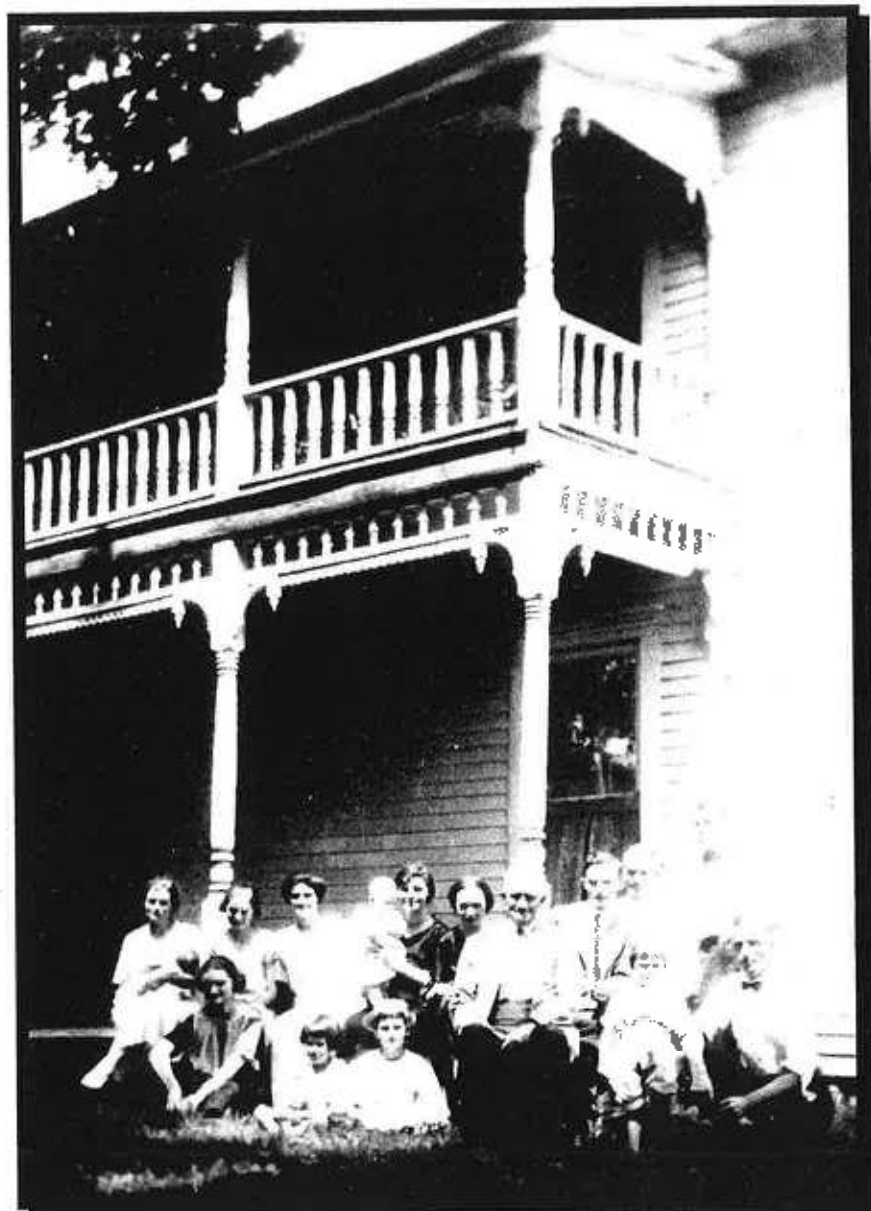
The next born was Arthur, June 29, 1886. He is between his brother Horace and his father.

The fifth born was Isham, named for his father. He was born October 26, 1888. He is standing behind his mother.

The next child born, was Elizabeth Lillian, but called Betty. She was born October 6, 1892. She is the girl, in the pretty white dress, between her mother and her father.

And the last child, James Roy, was born June 21, 1899. Both he and Della died in 1970, the last of all the brothers and sisters.

I suspect that the photo was made by an itinerant photographer because of the odd photo composition and obvious use of a large camera.



The first picture is 107 years old and this one is 84 years old. I know this for it was made when my father had brought his new bride, Sara Nancy Yent, to Tennessee to meet his family. All the brothers and sisters were there along with what appears to be, five of their children.

I also know about the lovely home shown in both pictures. It was built by my grandfather for his bride Elizabeth in about 1877. The interior had what was called a "dog run" which was a hall from the front porch to the rear porch. This hall allowed nice breezes to circulate in the warm months. The living room opened off the hall to the left, a bedroom opened off to the right. The dining room opened off the hall, behind the bedroom. Upstairs were three bedrooms, the front ones with doors to the balcony porch. The back of the house was in the shape of an L, with the kitchen in that area.

The interior walls and ceilings of the house were beautiful, with narrow double grooved boards, tightly fitted, from floor to ceiling and then across the ceiling. They were of a rich, medium brown color. The exterior of the clapboard house was always painted white. There were several tall trees planted across the front of the house which provided welcome summer shade. This being a farmhouse there was barn behind the house and fruit trees around it.

AUNTS, UNCLES, AND DAD

My Dad, James Roy Haston, was the youngest of the four Haston brothers born to Isham and Elizabeth Catherine Haston in a twenty-year period (1879 to 1899). He also had three older sisters born in that period of time. His mother died of pneumonia when he was only eight years old. He told me that his youngest sister, Betty, just seven years older than he, became "my second Mother."

I would like to write a few of my memories about Isham and Elizabeth Catherine and their seven children so that a reader of this genealogy may feel a bond to them.

The story begins romantically – Papa Haston, as I always called Isham, my grandfather, built the wonderful house for his bride Elizabeth. It became more beautiful by the time I first saw it in 1929 – a row of about six trees (oak, I believe) were planted in a row across the front of the house – a little out from the sweeping front porch distinguished by six columns standing from the ground level up through the balcony to the roof. I'll be quick to say it was not a "grand southern plantation home," but instead, a beautiful farmhouse. Later in this genealogy, I will describe "life on the farm" as spent in the summers by my brother, cousins and me.

Now, a few words about **Isham's and Elizabeth's** seven children as I knew them in my youth. There are only two of my generation still living in 2006 – my cousin, Johnetta Lewis Smith (Betty Haston's daughter) who will be 93 years old in July, 2006, and I, who will be 82 years old in May, 2006.

The oldest son was **Horace**, born 1879. I never knew him as he died long before I was born. My father told me that Horace was riding his horse doing chores in the area one day and that his horse came back to the barn that night without Horace. The family found him the next morning lying on the frozen earth with a broken leg. They carried him home, but he soon died of pneumonia.

The second born son was **Arthur**, or "**Uncle Art**," as I called him. I must say here, the two uncles I knew, both resembled my Father – all three were very tall (my dad was 6'2"), slender in build, and very nice looking. Uncle Art seemed the most serious one in manner and Uncle Ica had the most jovial manner of the three. I loved both of my uncles very much and each of them made me feel very special.. Art was a bachelor most of his life and he took care of the family farm for many years. In late life, he married a lovely widowed lady who taught school and who had a grown daughter. My family and I met her once when we visited their small mountainside home several miles out of Chattanooga, Tennessee. They were most hospitable. They had even wrapped up a small gift for each of our children. Uncle Art left a monetary bequest in his Will "to each of my nieces living at the time of my death". I was much honored, but did not accept it as his lawyer wrote of my Aunt Bennie Mae's poor health and financial need. She, incidentally, lived to over 100 years of age!!

The third born son, **Isham**, or "**Uncle Ica**" to all his nieces and nephews, was always fun to be with. Whether in Tennessee or Florida (my home state). When I first knew him he

was a motorman (or driver) of a street car which ran on tracks about a block from his and Aunt Ruth's Chattanooga home. What a thrill it was for my brother and me to have free rides with him. In later years he built a "tourist court" (a motel in today's language), at the foot of Signal mountain... (Uncle Art lived up on that mountain). The "court" was built up on three long horizontal walls, made of bricks and landscaped beautifully between the levels - He had a Shell "filling station" (again, languages of the 30's and 40's). He also built a brick restaurant near the station (both facing the road for easy access). His and Aunt Ruth's home was up a hill across from the court and behind the station. He never refused my brother and me of candy or a cold drink when we "tracked" down the hill.

The fourth son was, of course **my father** He was called by various versions of his name, **James Roy Haston**. His family and early friends always knew him as "Roy." He was "Hasty" to his wife, Sara Nancy, close friends and the in-laws family from the time of his marriage to the end of his life; "Mr. Haston" to his business colleagues; and to Jim" by friends in later years. For my brother and me he was first, "Daddy"; as adults, "dad." Dad was successful career wise. He went from being a "drummer" (so called in the 1920s and 30s) or traveling salesman, to a regional manager (Florida, Georgia, Alabama, and South Carolina) for R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company. He retired at 55 years of age and after 35 years of service. He did not remain idle long... He next became associated with Security Life Insurance Company, followed by a number of years as Vice President of Northside Bank of Tampa (a job he really enjoyed).

Dad was a quiet, thoughtful man, a true "Southern Gentleman." I must add that he was also a very handsome man! He had many friends and business acquaintances... Dad and Mom loved to dance together at parties He often had a good joke to tell. He and his friend, "Blackie," enjoyed fishing together from a row boat or the neighboring docks on Lake Madeline... He enjoyed going to professional wrestling matches and took me with him when we visited Tampa, "Granddad" would take each of our sons, at appropriate ages, with him to his Methodist Church men's' Sunday School classes (they became honorary members). He would take his grand daughters out for breakfast or lunch, just the two of them. He loved his family and we all loved him. I still miss him often all these years!

Next, to recollect a bit about the **three Haston daughters**, all "southern belles", in the truest sense.

Della, first-born daughter (1881), was a lovely and very sweet person ...She had a graceful, quiet manner and her home was always "open" to close and distant family members. I was always impressed to know her fortitude in rearing two daughters alone when their father was no longer there. She was also amazing in all she did, with her brother, Art; in helping operate the Haston family farm.

, **Arrie** was the second born Haston daughter (1884). She was a beautiful woman, easy to know and love. She kept a very nice two storied home in Winston Salem, North Carolina, as did Della. All three sisters were absolutely fabulous cooks. On one of our many visits, she arose about 4:00 a.m. and cooked us the best meal to carry along as breakfast and lunch as we headed out early to return home to New Jersey. (despite the fact we had strongly told her not

to do so). And she always insisted on giving each of our children a dollar bill as we left her home.

Betty was the third sister in line (1892). I remember her outgoing manner, one who readily gave a smile and a hug to her kinfolk. She had an inviting, well kept home in the small town of Spencer, Tennessee. I particularly loved her side yard that had green, green grass and such pretty flowers and shrubs. My brother and I liked to play there with our cousin, "Buster" (real name of Sterling) and his sister, Lillian. Our oldest cousin there, Johnetta, 11 years my senior, was a "true treat" when she was home. She had the most beautiful thick golden hair that must have reached her waistline and which she usually wore braided around her head. Aunt Betty would greet us each visit with the question "what did Arrie and Della cook for you?" Then she would proceed to "out do" herself in preparing our meals, we felt sure, to out class her sister's meals! I still have two beautiful needlepoint pictures she made and gave to me.

When my husband, Averill, and I were in London England, about 1985, I selected a telephone book and looked up the name "Haston". I found several listed. Choosing one, I dialed the number. A woman responded and we conversed for a while. She seemed surprised that there were Hastons in America. Her comment was "weren't they brave". I guess they were, for Daniel, our first positively identified ancestor was known to have been a soldier in the American Revolution.

We recently received, from Louise Haston Rice, an "E Mail" address which brought us much more information about Daniel, and his son, David. Rather than repeat all of that I've learned, I've listed that address here, so you (or your children) may use it.... www.danielhaston.com. Reverend Wayne Haston is the author of the material you will receive.

The number of children Daniel had is uncertain, but may have been as many as 13. It is probable that the first one was David. Wayne's "E Mail" includes much information about him.

David was an extremely active father, citizen and worker. There are over 200 citations, taken from various records, which tell of David's involvement. Not the least of these is the birth of 13 children to him and Peggy Roddy.

One of their children was Isaac T. born in 1827, In fact, Isaac was their 12th child. He is the one who appears next in the Haston line for us. We know little about him beyond the fact that he married Elizabeth Sparkman.

Isaac and Elizabeth had 11 children, the fourth of which was a son they named Isham, who was born in 1852. This Isham is the one noted in Section A of this genealogy, he built the beautiful farm house for another Elizabeth, this one named Elizabeth Catherine Parker. She may be your great-great grandmother or perhaps great-great-great grandmother. In fact, the third section of this "Family History" the one lettered "C", relates to her, and thus to you.

I'm sure you have noticed the prolific ancestors you have had. Of course this includes Isham and Elizabeth who had 7 children.

What you will find if you examine the "Box Charts" which show the descendants of THOSE 7 children, is that they had only a total of 14 children. Their names are listed below. Only two still live. See *

C The French Connection

The information about my grandmother's background has been taken from the book "Notable Southern Families", volumes 3&4. As you will see, her line extends through seven generations until, with Elizabeth Catherine Parker's marriage, it joins the Haston line. To make the last names changes clearer, I have numbered the generation changes, FIRST through SEVENTH...

FIRST GENERATION. (The French Connection). Guillaume Tonnelier was born in France in 1675. His parents' and wife's names are not known. The surname was derived from an occupation, meaning barrel maker or cooper. Several years after the revocation of the "Edict of Nantes", this progenitor of the American Tunnell descendants fled his native France.

Guillaume, his wife and their infant son, settled near Scarbrough, North Riding, Yorkshire, England, in 1702 or 1703. The name was Anglicized to Tunnel. Guillaume and his wife died in England and are buried there.

SECOND GENERATION William Tunnel, son of Guillaume Tonnelier was born in 1702 or 1703 and settled with his parents, as an infant, in England... He married Lady Ann Howard of Yorkshire. They immigrated to America in about 1736. They settled near Fredericksburg, VA and later the moved to Fairfax, near the Potomac River. William died December 28, 1787. Lady Ann died February 18, 1814 (104 years old, according to a Bible record). Lady Ann, as she was known throughout her life, reportedly forded the Clinch River on horseback after she celebrated the centennial of her birth.

William and Lady Ann had 4 sons, all of whom became clergymen. Sons William and Stephen were Patriots of the War for American Independence.

This record is designed to record and preserve the line of descent from William Tunnel, born 1751. The double "l" ending of the name Tunnell was assumed by William and his brother, Stephen and their families.

THIRD GENERATION William Tunnell, was born 1751, and died Aug 16, 1814. He married Mary Maysey on December 9, 1774 in Fairfax County, VA. Mary and William had 7 sons and 7 daughters.

FOURTH GENERATION Lettice Tunnell, the fifth child of William and Mary, was born February 26, 1781 in Fairfax, VA. Later she moved with her family to North Carolina and still later to Robertsville, Anderson County, Tennessee. In 1799 she married James Worthington, son of Samuel and Elizabeth Carny. James was a soldier in the War of 1812. It is said that he died at Fort Strother.

It is interesting to note that the surname Worthington, like many other family names, derived from the locality where the first known progenitor of the family resided. James' name is credited with being from three Saxon words:---Wearth-in-town, i.e. Farm-in-town. It is said, by some, of originally having been spelt "Weorthington": and then translated into modern English as Worthington. Knoxville, Tennessee records show both spellings.

FIFTH GENERATION William Worthington, the second child born to James Worthington and Lettice Tunnell, was born on December 22, 1801 in Van Buren County, TN. He also died in Van Buren County. William married his first cousin, Betsey Worthington. They had 3 sons and 5 daughters. .

SIXTH GENERATION Lodemia, the second child of William Worthington and Betsey, was born June 22, 1831. Lodemia married Arthur Parker, a Baptist minister in 1849 in Spencer Tennessee... Once again we find a large family. Lodemia and Arthur Parker had 3 sons and 5 daughters. The person who interests us most is a daughter, Elizabeth Catherine. .

SEVENTH GENERATION Elizabeth Catherine Parker was the 4th child born to Lodemia and Arthur Parker. She was born on July 26, 1856 and became a Haston on November 25th 1877 when she married Isham Haston. She was my grandmother on the Haston side (I am her granddaughter, Carolyn Haston Keith).

"Memories" by Carolyn

I was five years old when I first visited my "Papa" Haston's farm in Hickory Valley, Tennessee. The valley is located between Sparta and Spencer, (two very small towns). They are between Chattanooga and Knoxville, Tennessee. I've never since seen a more beautiful and peaceful spot in the world in any of my travels over the past 76 years.

My cousin Kathryn, (about 18 years old), had lived with our family in Florida, while she attended a business college in Tampa... She asked if she could take me, by train, to Tennessee, with her for the summer.

My mother later said she never knew how she let me go. Primarily, I remember the long train ride, eating in the dinner, and sleeping in a berth with Kathryn. Soon, I met my Step Grandmother Haston for the first and only time.

I remember the beautiful, old farmhouse, primarily, in pecking out the living room window to watch Kathryn and her beau, Conner, "smooch" as they sat in the front porch swing. (She later married him!)

My brother, Jimmie, and I spent several full summers on the farm... My dad would join us for his two week vacation with my mother, Uncle Art, Aunt Della, and some others... Cousins, Sterling ("Buster,") and his sister, Lillian often joined us. There were always fun things to do: fishing in the pond on the property, picking fruit from the orchards, riding on Uncle Art's hay wagon and getting dumped in the hayloft on the barn's second floor. And, the ride home, of course. Occasionally, we'd pick wild blackberries along the road-side, for Aunt Della to make her delicious pies, chase lighting bugs around the yard to capture them in glass jars, play the old discarded organ that sat on the "L" shaped back porch, run across the fields to a sandy road where the "traveling merchant" stopped once a week in his tiny open truck and then spend our pennies for candy.

We used kerosene lamps for lighting (no electricity) and yes, if we had to go "potty", there was a "3 hole out-house" with the usual Sears and Roebuck catalog hanging on a nail by the door. It was situated a short distance from the back porch

In Aunt Della's bedroom, there was the proverbial double-sized bed with a huge feather mattress which we kids always rushed to get under so that we were protected from lightning striking us during a rain storm. It was exciting and fun (even a bit scary!)

My mother learned where Aunt Della disappeared to late each afternoon. It was in the cool dirt-floor and wall cellar under the kitchen where they kept not only perishable foods, but also the wine made on the farm from grapes and berries! Needless to say, Aunt Della then had a sister-in-law to join her for a little relaxation after the vigor of the day and before eating a supper of fried chicken, mashed potatoes, turnip greens, corn bread and pie. The two ladies never told the kids where they were!

I must not forget to add that Uncle Art drove their sheep herd up on the mountain to graze in the meadows all summer long. It was a fascinating event

My dad told me in later years that had he realized how much I wanted him to buy the farm, he probably would have bought it for our family... Instead, a cousin bought the place...

Many years later on a family Tennessee vacation, we took several (if not all) of our children plus, I'm fairly certain, our young niece, Nancy Lee Haston, to see the farm house - A very special thing occurred. While parked there, who should arrive with a mule-drawn wagon full of hay, but the distant cousin who owned the place! He invited the kids aboard to ride and drive to the barn! A fitting conclusion to my much beloved Haston farm...

An interesting event has taken place for many years (and as far as I know still continues) on a certain weeks-end in August at the little framed church, which was easily visible from the Haston farmhouse front yard. A business meeting is first held inside the church with neighboring farm families from all around sitting on the wooden pews. Afterwards, all gather outside, with picnic baskets brimming over with unbelievably good food, spread out. Everyone has a good time eating and visiting with the many kids running about "hooting and hollering". Family hound dogs join in the fun and eating "left-overs"!

Finally, for two or three hours, every one gets to taking care of their family burying plots (the prime reasons for the annual gathering... Weeds are pulled up, grass is mowed, flowers planted. The stone markers on tombs vary and are unique. Some are very, very old. A number of Haston are buried here and relatives come each year to participate in the. Long-time annual get together.

I feel very privileged to have been a part of the "cemetery gathering" twice, as an adult accompanied by several of my close family as well as several aunts, uncles, and cousins.

Several years later Averill and I drove back to the area to see the farm, but we could not find it. Stopping at a Haston mailbox nearby, (there were many boxes with the name of Haston) we learned the house burned to the ground two or so years earlier. It was a sad conclusion to earlier happy times.

**“Pedigree: As defined in the American Heritage Dictionary:

In order to tie together all of the Box Charts in the previous sections of this genealogy, we have elected to make the final display using “Pedigree Charts”. Unlike the Box Charts we have used in previous displays, this format begins with the youngest person and goes back to the oldest known ancestor or ancestors. It does not exhibit parallel family lines, such as separate lines for each of the children of Isham and Elizabeth; it always starts with one person. In this case we have started with Myrtle Della. You can substitute your grand parent who was a sister or brother to Della to complete your “Line of Ancestors”.

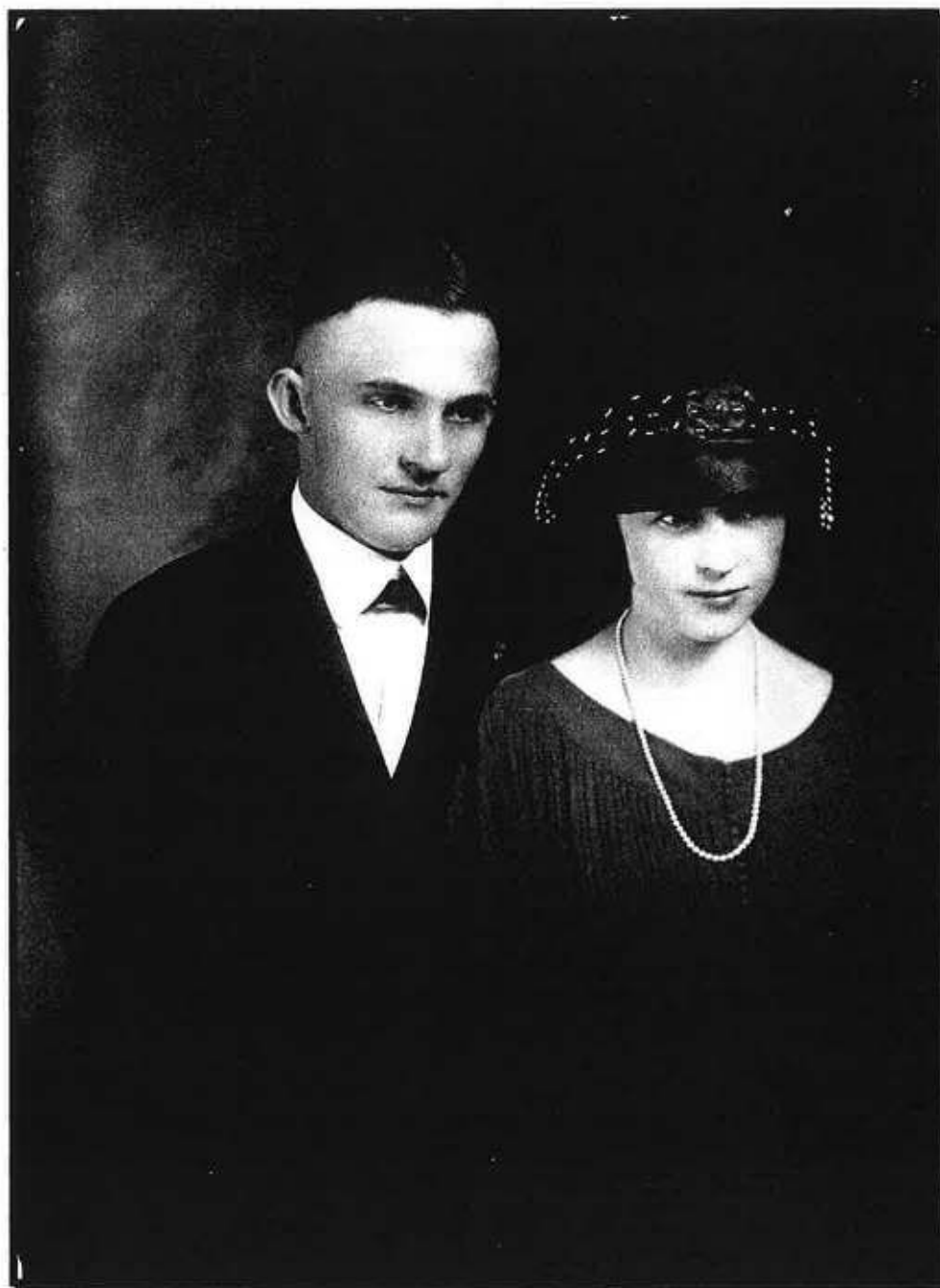

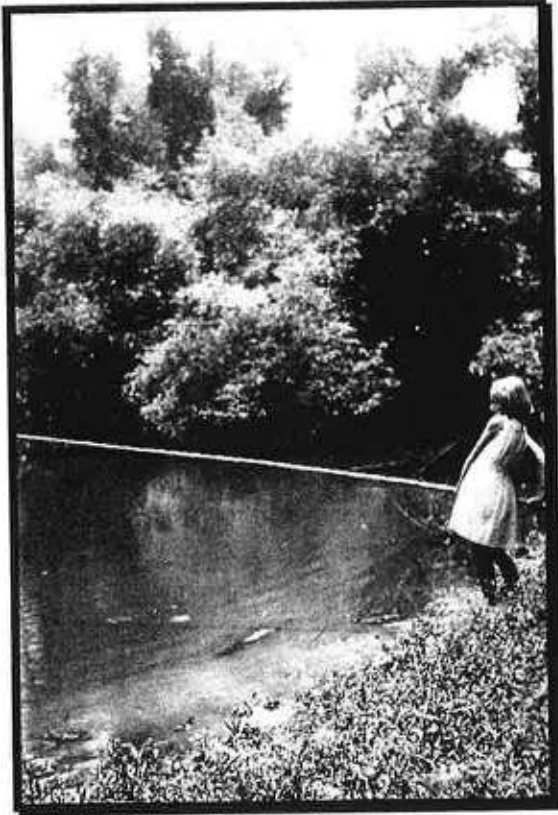
