General Sam Dale.

On October 13, 1968, a long-sought memorial was dedicated to one of the South's great frontier heroes, General Sam Dale, at Daleville, Mississippi.

Sam Dale (1772-1841) was a Federal Scout, Trail Blazer, Indian Fighter, Legislator and Wagon Train Leader.

His exploits included an eight - day, 700-miles horseback ride through hostile territory to carry War Department dispatches to Andrew Jackson at the Battle of New Orleans, and a canoe fight on an Alabama river in which he killed nine Indians, One by one.

He was the only white man to witness one of Chief Tecumseh's war talks, and was elected to the Alabama Legislature several times.

When General Dale died in 1841, a stately Choctaw Chief stood at the site of the present Memorial and said" Big Sam, you Sleep Here, but your Spirit is a Brave and a Warrior In The Hunting Grounds Of The Sky".

This narrative starts with John Dale who was born in 1763. He was reared in Virginia, and was a soldier from Faucuier Co. Va. during the Revolutionary war.

His Pension Application is found on pages 7- 8-9.

The names of his parents are unknown, but the legend is- that Dales lived in Ireland, Scotland and Wales and some Dales lived in England before coming to America.

They settled in Virginia.

John Dale fought in the Rev. War and was in the Va, line. He died 26 August in 1833.

He was married twice, Name of his first wife is unknown but John Dale and his first wife had two sons (1) Daniel, (2) John H. Dale and three daughters, (1) Jane, (2) Lucinda, and (3) Frances, called Franky.

John Dale married 2nd. Lucy Britt 25 Feb. 1813 at a place called Step Hill in the Woods in Jackson Co. Tenn.

John Dale and LucyBritt Dale had one son , Julian and two daughters (1) Eliza and (2) $^{\rm P}$ olly Malinda.

Children of John Dale and his unknown first wife, were (1)Daniel a son born between the first of January and 14 une 1793. He, probably was born in Clark Co. Ky. and died in St, Clair Co. Mo. after June 1855.

2)Jane Pale a Baughter , B--- P--- married Pleasant White (3) John Pale, a son , born between 1800 and 1810, married Margaret---- . He was killed by lightning on Aug. 2nd. 1847 near Sparta , White Co. Tenn. Margaret Pale , wife of

John H. Dale , born 1813 . Died between 26 July 1850 and March 1852. then the three younger children were bound out.

- (4) Lucinda, a daughter, B D. Married Thomas Lewis. Their children were-(1)Clemintine, (2)William G.(3) James H.
- (4) Minerva, (5) Lucy Jane Lewis.

Abstract of Pension Application of John Dale or (Deel) W. 725.

Va. Service Widow Lucy Britt Dale.

Revolutionary War, White Co. Tenn. Aug. 31 1832 S.S.

Personally appeared in Circuit Court, John Deel as he thinks he was called while in the Revolutionary War; A resident of said county aged 69 years; Born in 1763 according to his family register at home; that he entered service Feb. 27 1779, in 6th. Reg. Va. State Troops, for 18 Months under Captain Wayles in Fauruier Co. Va. where he than resided; Marched to Alexandria Va. then on southward to Petersburg, where his company joined the brigade of General Scott, Colonel Abraham Blueford commanding, who shortly after was replaced by Captain Howard with 1st. Lieutenant Wilson of the Company.

After sometime there (Petersburg) they marched toward Charleston but got no farther than Lanews ? Ferry on the Santee and Charleston was taken.

They were pursued to Waxhaw Settlements on Hanging Rock Creek in Carolina, defeated and dispersed by the enemy 20 May 1780.

He returned to Fauduier Co. Va. then went to Fredericksburg and joined Colonel Christian Febecker's Regiment and served out his 18 months; Received his discharge, which he lost many years ago. He was appointed Recruiting Sergeant by Col. Febecker until discharged in August 1780.

He again enlisted as a militia man under Cantain Valentine Payton of Prince William County and served 3 months; Marched to Williamsburg; thence to Mobin Hills on the James river; Retreated to Orange Co. Va. where Col. Elias Edmonds, a continental soldier joined their forces. They pursued the enemy to Old Jamestown, Had a skirmish as the enemy took to their boats. Major Armistead, one of their officers was a Continental officer.

Were under command of General Lafayette and General wayne. Discharged at Richmond; and while there, the enemy advanced to Manchester, across the river, were fired upon by one of Captain Colemans brass field pieces and some men were killed. The enemy then marched down the river, set fire to some warehouses and destroyed a large quantity of tobacco. He enlisted and served three months as substitute for Michael

He enlisted and served three months as substitute for Michael Myers, of Facuier Co. Va. under Captain William Frost, of Fredersburg Va. under General Lafayette;

His last term he served in lower part of Virginia.

Was drafted in Militia in Prince William Co. Va. where he was then residing;

Was marched to near Fredericksburg and returned into Fairfax and Prince william Counties. Engaged as a pioneer in opening roads for baggege wegons of General Trahington., then marching to Yorktown to besiege Cornwellis for abour one month; Had some written discharges, but pocket book was stolen. He lived in Tou uier and Prince William Counties during the war; being then a single man; Kemoved to Wilkes Co. Ga.

After three years, returned to Virginia Bedford Co.
In 1788 went to Clark Co. Ky. After 19 years there, went to Jackson Co. Tenn. Kemained there nearly five years then moved to White Co. Tenn. where he has resided ever since.

In the name of God amen. I, John Pale of the county of White and of the state of Tenn.being weakiin body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do make and publish this, my last will and testament, in manner and form following (That is to say), First I give and becueath unto my beloved wife, Lucy Dale the house and farm I now occupy, One bay mare, One womansaddle, One bed and furniture, One cow and calf and \$10 in cash, which she is to enjoy during her natural life or widowhood, as she isoto be at the expense of raising and schooling of the two youngest daughters to wit; Julian (son), Fliza (daughter), and Polly Malinda (daughter. Which said three children is to have all the household furniture after their Mother's death, or as they become of age.

They are to have their proportional part of the said furniture. I also give unto the said Julian, one certain sorrel mare, three year old filly with saddle and bridle, rated at \$ 125.00. One cow and calf, two head of sheep, One sow and pigs at \$15. and one third of the above land.

I also give and bequeath unto my two youngest daughters, Elizar and Polly Malinda; Eliza is to have a certain sorrel mare with white legs, three years old, bridle and saddle rated at \$ 125. One cow and calf, two head of sheep, one sow and migs \$ 15. and one third of the aforesaid land.

I give and becueath unto Polly, one black filly, saddle and bridle rated at \$\mathbb{C}\$ 125.00, one cow and calf, two head of sheep, one sow and pigs\$\mathbb{C}\$ 15. and onethird of the aforesaid land, and in case any of the above children should die without leaving a lawful heir. then and in that case, the said property is to revert back to the balance of the heirs to be equally divided.

I also give and bequeath unto my son, John Dale the tract of land he now lives on, situated in the North western corner of my claim in Hickory Valley and bounded agreeable to the lines made by Woodrow P. White, except on the southern boundary line,

It is to run from the Post Oak corner, running across the said Southern boundary, a direct line to Doyle's line in a sink near the oil field, running thence around west Doyle's line to John White's, and with his line to the aforesaid marked lines, Rated at \$ 250.00. One horse ,saddle and bridle at \$ 95.00.

One cow and calf rated \$ 15. One bed and coverlet \$20. One sheep \$1.50,-- \$ 4. worth of hogs; One chain \$ 31. which he has previously received and is in possession of the same.-

I also give and bequeath unto Pleasant White, one horse and saddle \$95.. Bed and furniture \$20. and one cow \$10. One sheep \$1.50.

Four head of hogs *12. One tract of land Mitchell place \$ 225.00.

Household furniture and colico \$5. Your receipt " fer" mill \$600.00. Half the price of mill irons and one lick chain \$7.50.

I further give and devise to my four grand children, William J. Malley, the wife of Henry Piddles their heirs and assigns all the land I hold in Jackson Co. on the waters of Russell's mill seat, containing by estimation, 470 acres, more or less to hold to their heirs and assigns forever.

I further give and devise to my son John Dale, his heirs and assigns, the following tract of land to wit; One hundred and thirty acres of land adjoining Joel Moonyhans land on Cumberland Mountain. Also one other tract on Cumberland Mountain on Rosse's road, known as the Sorrel's place containing 10 acres. One other tract of land on the brink of Cumberland Mountain above Jesse Dodson, south side of the main Caney Fork, containing 25 acres of land. Also one other tract of land near the Pine Nt. containing 50 acres known as the Sorrel's Place rated in all \$ 400.00. I also gove unto him one bay horse a year old \$50.00. One black cow and calf \$10. One rifle gun \$10. and the Gallaher tools \$26.00.

I also give and devise to my son -in-law Benjamin Mayes and his heirs 120 acres of land on the south side of the Main Caney Fork. adjoining Dan Griffith Esc. rated at \$ 480.00. and one gray horse three years old \$50.00.

I further give and bequeath to my son-in-law Thomas Lewis my horse" John" rated \$ 229.00. also one motley cow and calf \$ 15. This amount is expressly understood to be for the benefit of said Lewis children.--

I hereby retain for my own use and benefit, the house and land that I now occupy and one bed and furniture during my natural life.—Revoking all former wills by me made.

In witness whereof, I have here unto set my hand and seal, This 24 day of August 1833.. John Dale (Seal).

Dale, John Dale, Isabella Dale, Ida Lee Parish, lizzie Stephens and Marsha Ling, (The last may have been livings (or Givings)). are the owners of an undivided one third interest in said land.

Mary F. Mitchell, being duly sworm, according to law, declares that the foregoing is a true and correct cony of a decree rendered by the chancery Court of White Co. Tenn. in the cause of Thomas R. Dale et als Vs H. D. Hill et als, and found in book L. page 279 of the minutes of the chancery Court of White Co. Tenn. Mary Mitchell.

Tenn. and in White Co. Tenn. for several years, then moved to St. Clair Co. Missouri, and he died there sometime after 14 June Daniel Dale was a private in the company commanded by Captain Richard M. Rotten in the 4 th. Regiment of the Tenn. militie, commanded by Robert Steele in the war with the Creek Indians under the command of General Andrew Jackson. That he was drafted at White Co. Tenn. on or about the 25 of Jam. A. D. 1814, for the term of war, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of 3 months and 18 days and was honorably discharged at Fayetteville Tenn. on the 10 day of May A. D. 1814. as fully appears on his original discharge hereto annexed. He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty In Land to which he may be entitled under the act granting bounty I lend to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States, that massed 28 Sep. 1850. and further states that he has never received nor is he entitled (as far as he knows) to tany militarybounty land under the act of Congress hereto fore passed.

Robert Steele Captain of 4 th. Regiment Tenn. State of Missouri; County of St. Clair. On this 14 day of June ALD. D. One thousand and fifty five, personally appeared before me, a justice of the County Court within and for the County and State aforesaid, Daniel Tale aged 62 years, a resident of St. Clair Co. in the state of Nissouri, who being duly sworn according to the law and declares that he is the identification Dale who was a private in the company commanded by Captain Richard F. Rotton in the Regiment of Tenn. Militis, commanded by Colonel Robert Steele in the war with the Creek Indians, for the term of three months and 18 days and continued in actual service in said war for 14 days; That he heretofore made application for bounty land under the Act Sep. 28 1850, and received a warrant no. 30762 for 40 acres which he has since legally disposed of and cannot now return. He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the additional Bounty of land to which he may be entitled under the Act approved the third of March 1855. He also declared that he has never applied for nor received under this or any act of Congress any bounty land warrant excent the one above mentioned. Born in London 1st. Dec. 1829 . was educated at Springhill college , Birmingham England.

In 1853, he was united to the Corrs Lane Chapel, Birmingham as a Co-pastor with John Angell James . on whose death in 1859, he became sole pastor.

Dale took a keen interest in National and Municipal politics. In 1886, he supported Chamberlain in opposition to Trish Home Rule, but this did not destroy his influence among Gladstonian Noncom ists.

At his death, 13 March 1895, he left an unfinished manuscript of the history of "congregationalism, which was completed in 1907 by his son W. W. Dale, Principal of Liverpool University. Other works of his are- On the atonement and the living Christ. on the four Gospels.
